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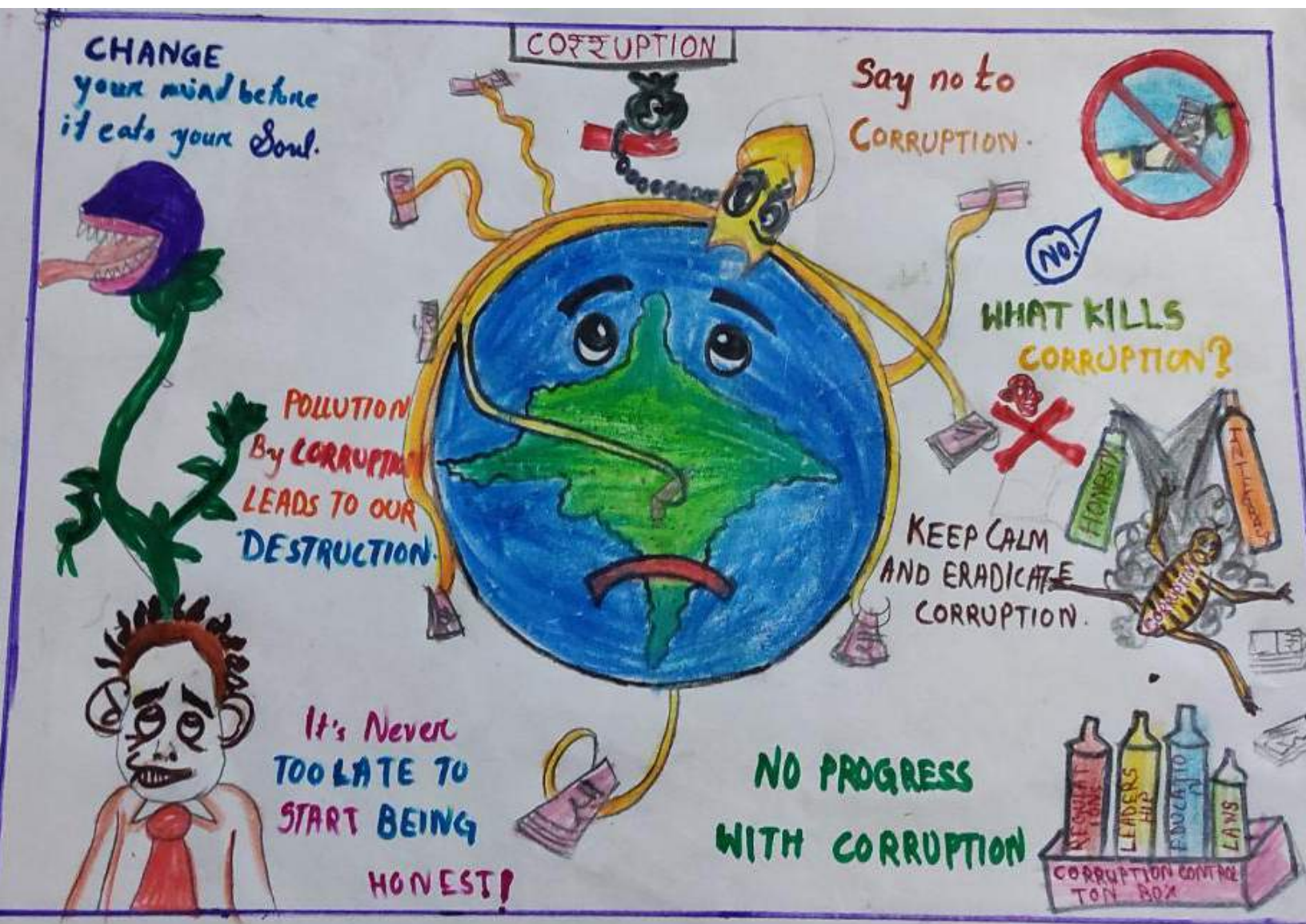
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Report on VIGILANCE AWARENESS PROGRAMME

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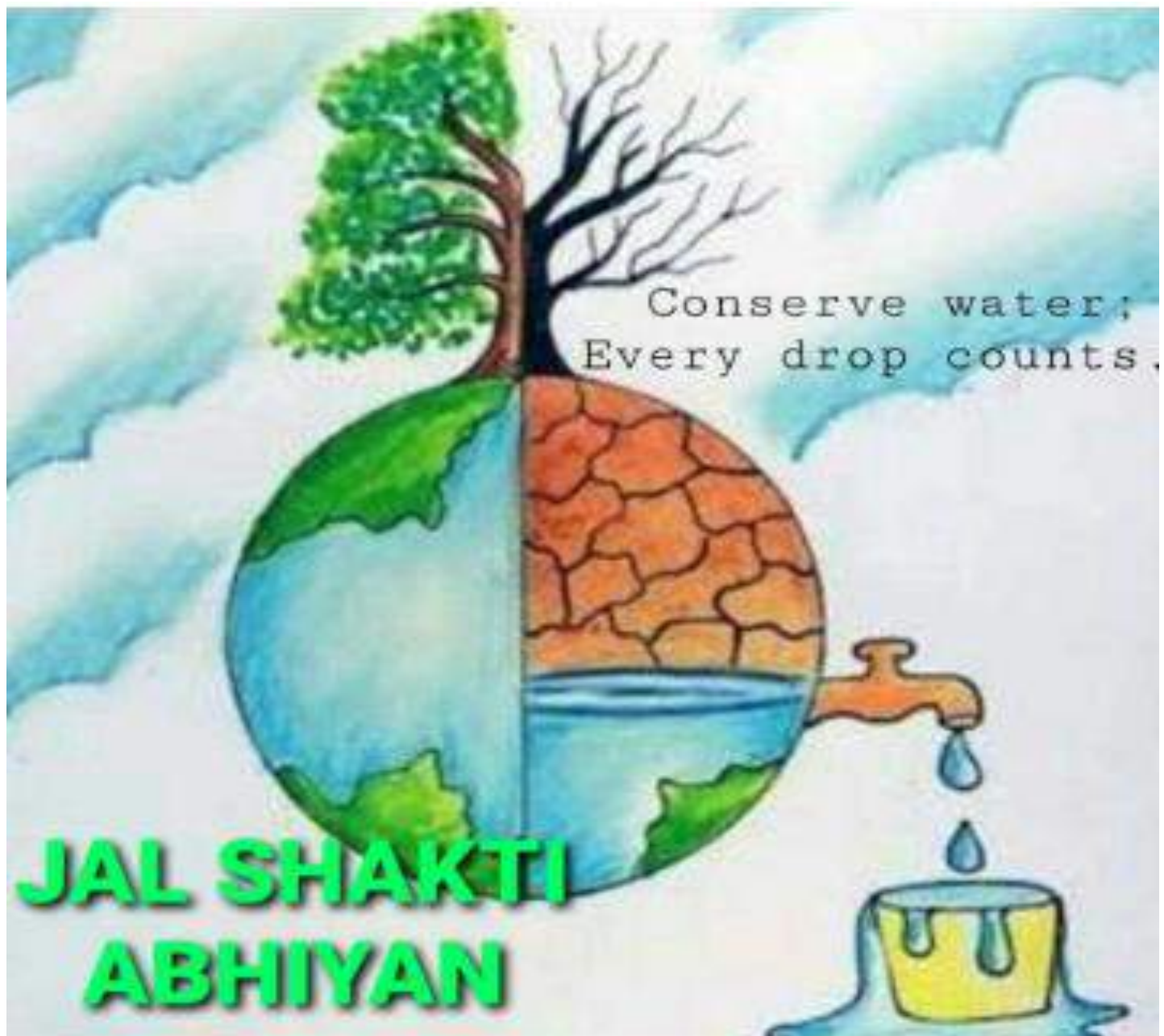

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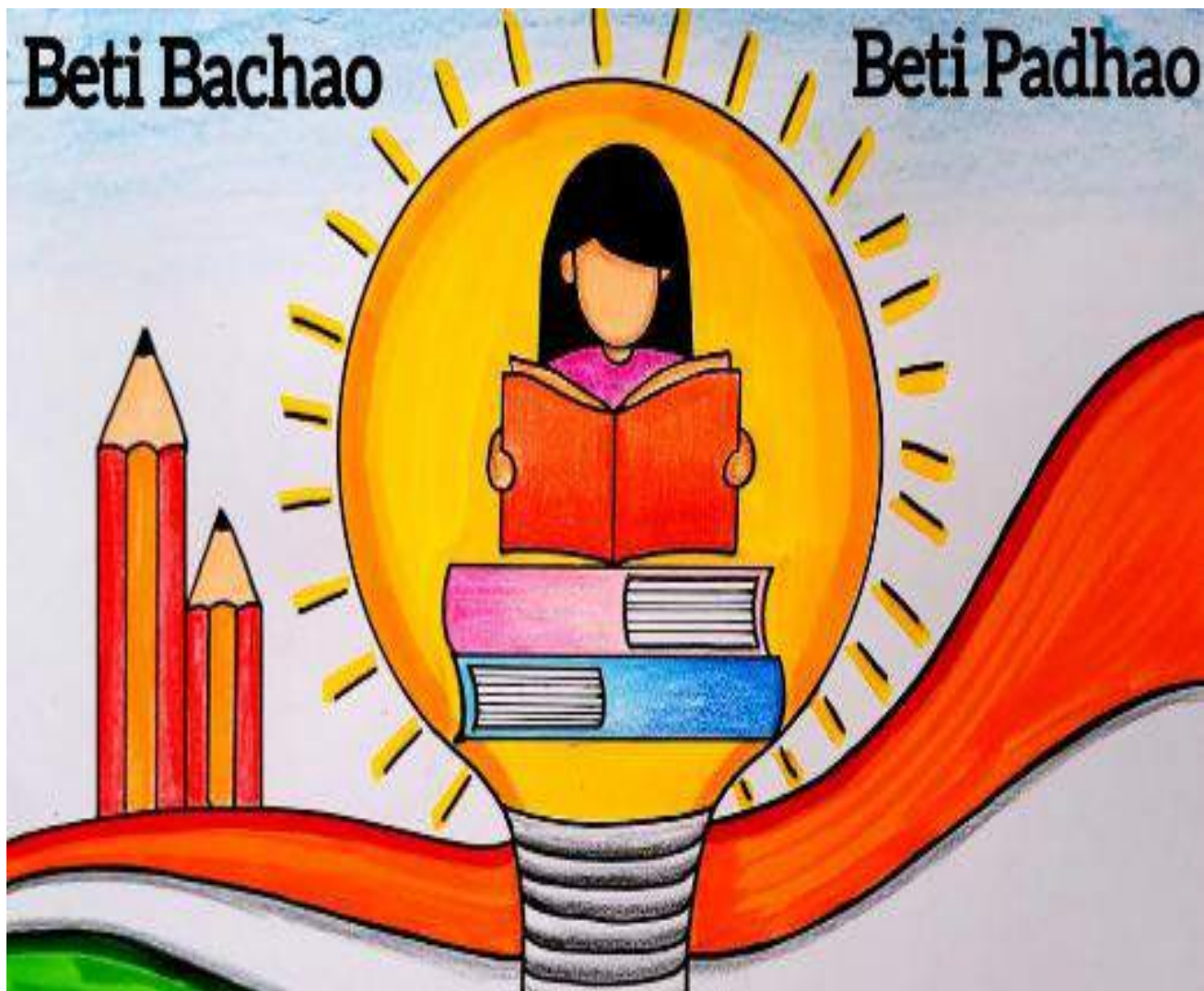

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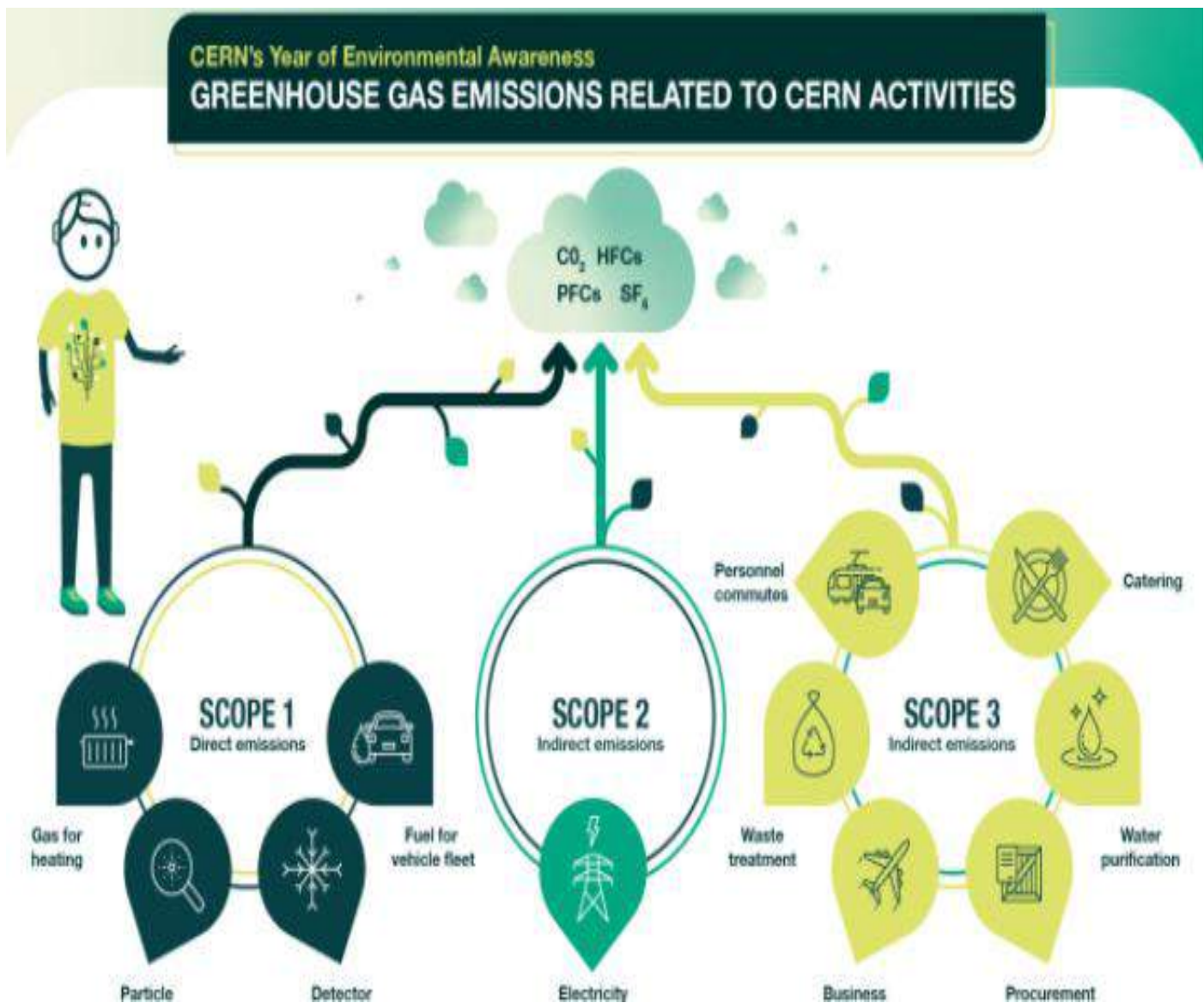
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REPORT ON **Environmental Awareness Programme**
